<b>Evaluates Peers</b>	Fills out peer evaluation completely and always gives scores based on the presentation rather than other factors (e.g., person is a close friend). Fills out most of the peer evaluation and always gives scores based on the presentation rather than other factors (e.g., person is a close friend). <b>Listens to Other Presentations</b>	Listens intently. Does not make distracting noises or movements.	Listens intently but has one distracting noise or movement. <b>Speaks Clearly</b>	Speaks clearly and distinctly all (100-95%) the time, and mispronounces no words.	Speaks clearly and distinctly all (100-95%) the time, but mispronounces one word. <b>Vocabulary</b>	Uses vocabulary appropriate for the audience. Extends audience vocabulary by defining words that might be new to most of the audience.	Uses vocabulary appropriate for the audience. Includes 1-2 words that might be new to most of the audience, but does not define them.	Uses vocabulary appropriate for the audience. Does not include any vocabulary that might be new to the audience.	Uses several (5 or more) words or phrases that are not understood by the audience.
<b>Uses Complete Sentences</b>	Always (99-100% of time) speaks in complete sentences.	Mostly (80-98%) speaks in complete sentences.	Sometimes (70-80%) speaks in complete sentences.	Rarely speaks in complete sentences.
<b>Stays on Topic</b>	Stays on topic all (100%) of the time.	Stays on topic most (99-90%) of the time.	Stays on topic some (89%-75%) of the time.	It was hard to tell what the topic was.
<b>Posture and Eye Contact</b>	Stands up straight, looks relaxed and confident. Establishes eye contact with everyone in the room. Hands are at side.	Stands up straight and establishes eye contact with everyone in the room. Hands are in pockets.	Sometimes stands up straight and establishes eye contact. Hands seem distracted.	Slouches and/or does not look at people. Uses the podium as a "crutch".

<b>Volume</b>	Volume is loud enough to be heard by all audience members throughout the presentation.	Volume is loud enough to be heard by all audience members at least 90% of the time.
